An update on the Bureau of Prisons Tribal Prisoner Program

- <u>Final Report</u> on Tribal Prisoner Program (review)
- Eligibility criteria:
  - Convicted of a violent crime comparable to the crimes described in 18 U.S.C. 1153(a).
    - BOP's reading of 1153(a) is reasonably broad
  - Sentenced to a term of one or more years of imprisonment with a minimum of one year
  - o left to serve at the time of referral to the BOP.
  - At least 18 years of age at the time of the offense.
  - Negative for active tuberculosis. BOP clinicians will administer a tuberculosis skin test (also known as a PPD test) following admission to the BOP facility. The offender must test negative to remain eligible
- Referral begins with completion of intake questionnaire to BOP
  - New intake questionnaire (review)
  - o Relationship with PSR program
  - o Send to BOP-CPD-DSC-PolicyCorrespondence-S@bop.gov
    - Who is on the other end?
    - How long will it take?
  - After designation
    - Notification
    - Open 30-day window for reporting to facility
    - Drop-off between 6 am and 2 pm
    - Ideally: T, W, Th; 7 am to 9 am, or 11 am to 1 pm
    - Front lobby
    - Bring credentials
    - Self-surrender is acceptable
    - Medicine supply will be replenished
